



Thomas, Apostle of India (Celebrated on July 03)



Thomas the Apostle, also called Didymus, was one of the Twelve Apostles of Jesus according to the New Testament. Thomas is commonly known as "Doubting Thomas" because he doubted Jesus' resurrection when first told of it; later, he confessed his faith, "My Lord and my God," on seeing Jesus' crucifixion wounds.

Born: Galilee, Israel

Died: St Thomas Mount, St. Thomas Mount, India

<u>Nickname</u>: doubting Thomas <u>Full name</u>: Judas Thomas

Buried: Santhome Cathedral Basilica, Chennai, India

According to traditional accounts of the <u>Saint Thomas Christians</u> of modern-day <u>Kerala</u> in <u>India</u>, Thomas is believed to have travelled outside the <u>Roman Empire</u> to preach the Gospel, travelling as far as the <u>Malabar Coast</u> which is in modern-day Kerala. According to their tradition, Thomas reached <u>Muziris</u> (modern-day North Paravur and Kodungalloor in the state of Kerala, India) in AD 52. In 1258, some of the relics were brought to <u>Ortona</u>, in <u>Abruzzo</u>, Italy, where they have been held in the Church of Saint Thomas the Apostle.
