Church: Reformed and Reforming

October 4th Sunday is Reformation Sunday. The protestant reformation was a broad movement in sixteenth century Europe. When the reformers sought to purify the church of unbiblical doctrine and practice, they often spoke of the need to 'reform' the church according to God's word. Although this was a reaction against the Roman Catholic church, it was also an embrace of the Scriptures unique authority, a return to the doctrine and practice of the Apostolic church, and an outgrowth of various reforming currents in the medieval church. While many of these changes took place at the hand of Martin Luther and his German Colleagues based in Wittenberg, a much more geographically diverse collection of Protestant theologians, ministers and congregations came to agree up on doctrinal creeds, liturgical reforms, and characteristics of church polity which became known as "Reformed".

Christ invites all into his kingdoms that is beyond human imagination. It is a community

where equality, justice, and peace reign. Reformed church must continue to reform herself and

the world around till the mission of God is accomplished. Amen



William Tyndale, (born c. 1490–94, near <u>Gloucestershire</u>, England—died October 6, 1536, Vilvoorde, near Brussels, Brabant), English biblical translator, humanist, and Protestant <u>martyr</u>. Tyndale was educated at the <u>University of</u> <u>Oxford</u> and became an instructor at the <u>University of</u> <u>Cambridge</u>, where, in 1521, he fell in with a group of humanist scholars meeting at the White Horse Inn. Tyndale became convinced that the Bible alone should determine the practices and doctrines of the church and that every believer should be able to read the <u>Bible</u> in his own language.

After church authorities in <u>England</u> prevented him from translating the Bible there, he went to Germany in 1524, receiving financial support from wealthy London merchants. His New Testament translation was completed in July 1525 and printed at <u>Cologne</u> and, when Catholic authorities suppressed it, at Worms. The first copies reached England in 1526. Tyndale then began work on an <u>Old</u> <u>Testament</u> translation but was captured in <u>Antwerp</u> before it was completed; he was executed at Vilvoorde in 1536.

At the time of his death, several thousand copies of his New Testament had been printed; however, only one intact copy remains today at London's <u>British Library</u>. The first <u>vernacular</u> English text of any part of the Bible to be so published, Tyndale's version became the basis for most subsequent English translations, beginning with the <u>King</u> <u>James Version</u> of 1611.
